**A talk on the Ingleburn Military Heritage Precinct
by historian Carmel Young**

This presentation by Carmel Young takes the audience on a virtual tour of the Ingleburn Heritage Precinct, offering insights into the Ingleburn Army Camp from its foundation to decommissioning, and registration on the New South Wales Heritage Register.

For much of its operational life the former Ingleburn Army Camp was a major centre for training recruits under various Commonwealth National Service Schemes. Thousands of men and women walked through its gates between 1939 and 1990. The experiences of these individuals are highlighted throughout this presentation, adding a human dimension to the material fabric of the site.

Carmel Young coordinated and lectured in the History Education and Combined Degrees programs, Faculty of Education and Social Work, University of Sydney. Prior to this she taught History and English in state secondary schools. Along with her fellow authors, Carmel was joint recipient of the 1997 New South Wales Premier's History Prize (Young People's History Writing) for *Unlocking the Past: Preliminary Studies in the Ancient World*.
