BDA – Biographical Database of Australia. www.bda-online.org.au.

BDA is a new research tool for historians and genealogists comprising transcripts and indexes of many original records and published biographies of deceased individuals who arrived in or were born in Australia, starting from the earliest times.

You can search the index for free but for \$30.00 a year personal or \$100.00 Library you get full access.

English & Welsh Probate Service. <https://probatesearch.service.gov.uk/#wills>

The Probate Service have added a searchable database online for the post-1996 wills and grants of probate, to complement its soldiers wills offering already available. If an entry is found from the search a full copy will cost £10 to access.

New Zealand Service Records www.Archives.govt.nz/world-war-one

14,000 Defence force records – free to download.

Historical Hospital Records Admission Project www.hharp.org/

Access this free database of nearly 120,000 records in the period 1852-1914 from the Royal Hospital for Sick Children, Glasgow and three London hospitals – the Hospital for Sick Children at Great Ormond Street, the Evelina Hospital and the Alexandra Hospital for Children with Hip Disease.

Irish Family History Online <http://ifhf.brsgenealogy.com>

This subscription website of the Irish Family History Foundation contains a searchable database of over 20 million records including over 9 million Births/Baptisms and 4½ million marriages, plus death/burials, memorial inscriptions and census returns. On registration you are able to view for free 100 pages of index searches but must purchase credits to view the actual records.
